<u>POSITION SUMMARY</u>: The hemodialysis tech performs dialysis and re-use duties under the supervision of a qualified dialysis nurse, maintains adequate supplies for the Center and operator maintenance of the machines and equipment. Responsible for compliance issues of reuse are being met.

## **QUALIFICATIONS:**

- 1. High school diploma or equivalent.
- 2. One-year experience in a hemodialysis unit or strong patient care experience in med-surgery preferred.
- 3. Selected basic care skills including aseptic technique.
- 4. Ability to recognize and respond appropriately for signs/symptoms of onset of complications of dialysis: i.e. hypotension, seizures.
- 5. Current Certification as a Patient Care Technician.
- 6. Understanding the importance of standardized technique and health hazards relating to poor performance.
- 7. Knowledge of design characteristics and principles of operation of the dialysis system as they contribute or inhibit the prescribed treatment results, as well as knowledge of dialysis procedures.
- 8. Basic knowledge/objectives of emergency medical treatment, therapy and dietary management of the patient with renal failure.
- 9. General understanding of transplantation as an alternative therapy.
- 10. Ability to maintain strict confidentiality of Dialysis Center patients and staff in a professional and positive manner.
- 11. Certified in CPR or certified within three months of hire.
- 12. Possess a valid driver's license and be insurable with company insurance.
- 13. Must be sensitive and possess an awareness and keen appreciation of Indian traditions, customs and socioeconomic needs of the Indian community.
- 14. American Indian preference in accordance with Indian Preference Act (Title 25, US Code, Sect. 472 & 473)

## **DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- 1. Administer and monitor dialysis therapy to patients, performing direct patient care dialysis procedures, i.e. taking vitals, blood lab work, utilizing dialyzer, etc.
- 2. Recognize and address onset of medical complications and/or inadequate response to dialysis therapy.
- 3. Familiar with, adhere to, and implement CMS October 14, 2008 Conditions for Coverage regulations.
- 4. Responsible for operation and maintenance of dialysis machines and related documentation.
- 5. Perform disinfection procedures and related documentation for Reverse Osmosis water system.
- 6. Perform chlorine and chloramine testing and hardness testing.
- 7. Obtain, order, and ship blood labs and water samples for testing and maintain related documentation.
- 8. Provide patient education as required.
- 9. Responsible for recognition of and notification to RN(s) of safety parameters (power outages, water pressure changes, equipment malfunction, etc.) Assist RN(s) as needed and assigned
- 10. Assemble all necessary supplies and equipment at chairside for each shift as well as restocking and maintaining clean stations and work areas.
- 11. Seal and dispose of bio-hazard materials accordingly.
- 12. Participate in the development of Patient Care Plans and QA/CQI programs as required.
- 13. Operate Doppler, oxymeter, and glucometer.
- 14. Administer heparin as needed and instructed.
- 15. Assist with clinical and equipment orientation of new staff.
- 16. Follow infection control guidelines and practice universal precautions, utilizing appropriate personal protective equipment as needed.
- 17. Monitor and ensure timely attention to preventative maintenance and repair on dialysis machines with appropriate documentation.
- 18. Perform all water tests according to AAMI standards and unit policy.
- 19. Monitor supply of parts for machines and order when necessary.
- 20. Monitor, test and document as needed for water samples.
- 21. Responsible for ensuring electrical tests are done initially on new dialysis equipment and annually thereafter.
- 22. Insure proper operation of the reverse osmosis system and take corrective measures as necessary.

- 23. Responsible for recognition of safety parameters in the Center: a) equipment malfunctions; b) water pressure changes; c) power shortages; and immediately report any action levels to Facility Administrator or designee.
- 24. Responsible for water system and dialysis equipment orientation for new staff.
- 25. Other job related duties as assigned.
